

Airthings Awarded EcoVadis Silver Sustainability Rating

Scores in the top 25 percentile of all companies participating worldwide.

Oslo, Norway (February 17, 2022) - Airthings, global leaders in indoor air quality solutions, has received a Silver rating from EcoVadis, the most trusted business sustainability ratings organization. Using their evidence-based assessment, EcoVadis ranks companies on a scale of 0-100 according to four different categories: environment, ethics, labor & human rights, and sustainable procurement. The cumulative weighted scores from these categories are then used to assign companies one of the following levels: no designation, bronze, silver, gold, and platinum.

“We are thrilled to have been awarded a silver ranking, putting us in the top 25% of companies scored, especially as this is our first year being considered,” said Oyvind Birkenes, CEO of Airthings. “We have a strong focus on improving our score, and are encouraged by the initial rating.”

What is EcoVadis?

EcoVadis rates over 85,000 companies in more than 160 countries in 200+ industries. The breadth of companies covered by their universal rating system allows for not only easy cross-company comparison but also comparison across the supply chain, helping companies find sustainable suppliers and track impact throughout their value chain.

The mission of EcoVadis is to develop a system to enable companies to make sustainable decisions, reduce risk, and improve social outcomes and performance. Their network both increases transparency and helps connect the global marketplace of leading sustainable companies; and it can help Airthings become even more sustainable and socially responsible.

Now that Airthings has received the results, the organization has clear guidelines on how to improve in order to reach a gold status. “We see that our current strengths are our environmental and human rights, diversity and inclusion policies,” said Erwin Hasselbrinck, Airthings’ Sustainability Manager. “Additionally, we scored well due to our relatively low carbon emissions and detailed product life cycle assessments. We plan to continue working in this area and develop plans to tackle any of our potential environmental and social risks.”
